



The Moon

The Moon tells you about your children's emotional nature and basic needs. It is also the key to how they experience intimacy in relationships. The Moon tells you about your children's relationship with their mother, how they experience their mother's nurturing. As a result it can also give you insights on how to best nurture your children as babies and maturing young adults. When a child feels safe and has their basic needs met, they are better able to achieve their goals later in life.

The Moon is in Pisces

Believe it or not young Jane Doe was extremely happy in her mother's womb. The birth process came as a rude shock, thrusting Jane Doe out of her comfortable, warm and watery environment. Therefore baby Jane Doe needs lots of cuddles and tender loving care. Soft-coloured furnishings and a quiet environment, close to mother, are ideal. Parents may like to invest in a baby sling so that Jane Doe can be kept close.

Jane Doe is a highly sensitive baby and needs longer than other babies to adjust to their new world. This sensitivity may also extend to foods, so parents need to be wary when introducing solid foods. Baby Jane Doe may want to breast feed longer than other children. The Moon is in the 10th House

Venus

The planet Venus describes your children's personal relationships with family and friends. Like a Moon, Venus is important in describing how your child prefers to interact. This planet also gives vital information about your child's receptivity to love. This is important because a child feels loved in different ways. Some children feel cherished when loved ones are paying them lots of attention, whereas others feel most loved when given the freedom to go their separate ways. Therefore gaining an understanding of the planet Venus in your child's chart can give you insights into how to encourage rewarding relationships with family and friends.

Venus is in Pisces

Astrologers consider the planet Venus to be well placed in the sign of Pisces resulting in satisfying relationships with friends and family. Jane Doe is a warm and loving child, enjoying intimate relationships with loved ones. Jane Doe is a sensitive child, able to understand the feelings of loved ones. However, she is easily hurt by harsh words. Jane Doe likes harmonious interaction, and often tries to escape into a world of her own if confronted with an angry companion. Once the mood has calmed down, then Jane Doe is ready to play again. She has a very forgiving nature, except under extreme circumstances. Even at a young age Jane Doe is likely to understand the nuances of relationships, possessing an ability to listen to and appreciate other people. The Sun

The Sun represents your child's identity. It describes your child's basic personality traits and their talents. It also tells you how your children think of themselves; how they need to express themselves; how they need to shine in their lives; how they feel alive. It is the centre of a child's self-expression. The Sun can also tell us about a child's father.

The Sun is in Aquarius

Jane Doe is a unique little individual. She is a restless baby, craving human company. Baby Jane Doe does not necessarily want to be held close, rather she wants to be able to watch what is going on in her little life. She likes plenty of action and interaction. Parents may worry about the fretful nature of baby Jane Doe; however, they soon notice the difference once young Jane Doe can crawl and walk, exploring the world for herself. Jane Doe is an independent child enjoying the company of other children and adults. It is unlikely that young Jane Doe holds on to her parents' apron strings. Jane Doe is more likely to have her parents chasing her. Of course this largely depends on whether or not Jane Doe is extroverted or introverted. She is likely to be an extroverted child exploring the world inside and outside the home. However, in some cases Jane Doe may prove to be introverted, exploring different activities in her own room. Jane Doe may be a quiet little professor building unique structures from blocks or model kits, carrying out scientific experiments or investigating the mechanics of the natural world.

The only sure thing about Jane Doe is that she is unpredictable. To say that Jane Doe does not respond well to authority is an understatement. Reason and distractions work better than strict application of rules. Jane Doe can be a little rebel, either with full-blown tantrums or with quiet stubborn refusal to conform. The Sun is in the 9th House

Mercury is in the 8th House

The Ascendant

The Ascendant, or Rising Sign as it's sometimes called, is considered to be an important component of an astrology chart. Ancient astrologers believed that the Ascendant depicted a person's primary motivation. Some believed that it was one of the links to discovering what makes a person happy. It could be said that when we're accomplishing our primary motivation then we're happy. By gaining knowledge of a child's Ascendant and discovering this child's primary motivation in life, parents and mentors can then help them achieve their goals. Caring adults can encourage the child with love and support. In turn your child experiences a sense of happiness and fulfilment.

The Ascendant is in Gemini

Jane Doe is likely to actively seek her goals, taking the initiative rather than waiting until circumstances are comfortable. Gemini is a Mutable sign denoting versatility, flexibility, adaptability, sensitivity, restlessness and indecision. It also an Air sign indicating a love of ideas, communicating and intellectual prowess.

Childhood Journey

Wouldn't it be ideal if we could isolate one trait in our personalities, capture it in a glass for observation and dissection? Of course this is not possible. Neither is it possible for us to isolate one part of a birth chart. The different aspects of our children's birth charts intermingle in a complex manner to make the little person that we know and love. However, it is possible for us to influence the development of our children, to support them in their journey. The aim of this section is to give vital clues for parents and mentors on how to guide, but not coerce, the development of your child.

Mars is Sextile The Moon

The combination of the planet Mars and the Moon is fiery and emotional. Young Jane Doe has plenty of energy and determination from a young age. A lively child, she delights in exploring new activities. She is independent and does not need the company of other children to keep her amused. In fact she may be a leader in the playground, showing other children how to get things done or she may be a loner preferring to forge her own individual path.

Parents delight in the initiative shown by young Jane Doe. This initiative needs to be encouraged, while at the same time firm boundaries need to be provided. There is an impulsive side to Jane Doe's nature, which may lead her into mischief. Therefore Jane Doe benefits most when both independence and safety are promoted. Parents may also want to support activities, which provide an outlet for Jane Doe's abundant energy. Individual sports, outdoor games or martial arts may be of benefit. In some cases Jane Doe may develop a habit of throwing temper tantrums when she doesn't get her own way. Much of this depends on other influences in Jane Doe's birth chart.

With other positive influences, Jane Doe may be quietly confident and somewhat serious. Either way a firm and loving hand and a warm environment can help Jane Doe overcome adversity and consequently feel secure and gain confidence. Criticism is to be avoided at all costs, because Jane Doe is more sensitive to harsh words than other children. Instead, parents need to do all that they can to boost Jane Doe's self-esteem so that she can mature into a confident adult. As Jane Doe matures, she overcomes adversity. She learns the advantages of hard work and self-discipline. The positive side to early-life difficulties is that Jane Doe has the wisdom of experience, and outstrips other children in her achievements. This combination of the planet Saturn and the Moon is an important one in astrology. In some cases, it simply acts to tone down other influences in a child's birth chart. For instance, a fiery child may seem more introverted under this influence. For a full explanation of the likely outcome of this combination it is best to visit a qualified astrologer.

Jupiter is Conjunct The Sun

Jane Doe is a sunny and optimistic child with an infectious smile and joie de vivre. Baby Jane Doe is welcomed into a warm and loving family. Jane Doe's father, or grandfather, is particularly excited by her birth and a warm and loving bond results. Jane Doe responds well to her father's praise, or to the positive comments of any male parental figure. She may share a close bond with her grandfather. These positive childhood relationships with adult males augur well for Jane Doe's relationships with men throughout her life. A generous child, Jane Doe enjoys new experiences and adventures. She has no trouble playing with other children, sharing her toys. In fact her infectious personality attracts many playmates. Jane Doe is kind and helpful and, depending on other factors in her birth chart, is likely to be a contented and well-loved child.

Saturn is Trine Mercury

Now here's a child who needs a lot of approval and support, particularly from her father or an important male mentor. The more love and kindness that Jane Doe receives, the more she is able to express herself in her daily life with confidence. The reason for this is that the combination of the planets Saturn and Mercury can be a difficult one, presenting some pitfalls in early childhood development. In other words young Jane Doe may face difficulties in her ability to learn and communicate. This, in turn, affects her self-confidence.

Jane Doe may be shy, preferring the safety of her home rather than venturing out and about. Jane Doe could be slow to talk and read. Perhaps school seems a bit overwhelming to young Jane Doe. She prefers to spend time reading in her own room rather than socialising with her friends. Jane Doe is sensitive to criticism, particularly any harsh words from her father or a prominent male member of the

family. On the other hand Jane Doe slowly blossoms when praised by her father. She also responds well to a male mentor's patient words of wisdom. Jane Doe needs a slow, methodical approach when being given any instructions. She works better within a structured environment. With calm handling Jane Doe gradually gains self-understanding and a wisdom that is beyond her years. Another positive note that is most of Jane Doe's learning difficulties are experienced in her early youth. As she matures, social and communication skills and study becomes easier. It is almost as if Jane Doe is born with a greater intelligence that needs to be carefully nurtured during childhood in order for it to be fully expressed as she matures.

As Jane Doe grows older, she is likely to excel in a specialised subject of her choice. Her selection of topic depends on other aspects of her birth chart. Parents need to make sure that Jane Doe is able to choose her own study topics as much as is possible. Excessive parental control could have a detrimental effect, eroding Jane Doe's budding self-confidence. It is interesting to note that the famous scientist Albert Einstein experienced learning difficulties at school, and yet later rose to prominence in his field. Einstein had a powerful combination (conjunction) of the planets Saturn and Mercury in his birth chart. The strength of this association depends on the nature of the astrological link. Parents may wish to consult an astrologer.

Uranus is Sextile Mercury

Jane Doe is a curious child, quickly showing an interest in all things in her immediate environment. Jane Doe is quick to learn new activities, grasping quite complex concepts sooner than her peers. Jane Doe requires plenty of stimulation. Otherwise she is easily bored and restless.

Jane Doe responds well to adult company and is particularly in tune with male family members. She enjoys interacting with her father, particularly if her father gives her the freedom to express her own thoughts. Parents and mentors need to cater for Jane Doe's intelligence by providing books, computers, and other education material. Jane Doe is likely to rebel against an authoritarian approach, preferring her independence. "Let me do it," may be a common childhood refrain. Jane Doe is likely to excel at school, particularly if teachers encourage her individual strengths rather than force her to conform. She may show an interest in an unusual topic, or share a common interest with her father.

Saturn is Opposite Venus

Jane Doe needs plenty of love and approval to successfully develop in childhood. She is naturally shy and hesitant to form close bonds with friends and family. This may be the result of friction in the family home, or a separation from a parent at an early age or it could simply be part of her personality. Whatever the cause, Jane Doe finds it difficult to trust loved ones. She finds it difficult to accept affection. She withdraws into a world of her own rather than asserting herself. Patience and love reap rewards. Jane Doe may never be an outwardly warm and spontaneous child, but with constant tenderness and affection from her parents, she can develop in the knowledge that she is worthy of love. Slowly and surely parents can teach Jane Doe to trust loving contact rather than fear it.

Jane Doe is particularly sensitive to antagonism by her mother. Therefore it is important that Jane Doe is able to experience warmth and understanding from her mother, or an important female member of her family.

Parents and mentors also need to encourage Jane Doe to interact with friends. She may relate better to older children, but it is important that she also learns to play with children of her own age. Jane Doe is likely to feel more comfortable with a small circle of true friends, rather than with many acquaintances. In rare cases this combination of the planets Saturn and Venus can simply act to slow down a very gregarious child, giving her the ability to form close ties with many friends.

Uranus is Conjunct Venus

What a little live wire! Jane Doe needs plenty of liberty to express her independence. Naturally inquisitive, she does not like to be tied down, but prefers to be free to explore her own interests. As such little Jane Doe's parents need to be very flexible with routines and social engagements.

Spontaneity is the key to successfully raising young Jane Doe. She loves surprises. She is a unique little individual with many and varied interests and friends. Jane Doe also has a tendency to act first and think later. This results in some exciting, if somewhat risky, adventures and activities. These may involve electricity, chemistry, fireworks or some sort of experiment with a difference. She can enjoy adventures on her but usually she likes to involve her friends in her escapades. Parents need to direct Jane Doe's excess energy into lively, but safe, activities. Benefits can be gained from enrolling young Jane Doe in children's sports or social clubs.

As Jane Doe grows older, she needs to be free to choose her friends and some of them might be quite unusual. Any interference from her parents is likely to be met with mutiny. Parents would be well advised to give Jane Doe her freedom, unless her friendships are particularly unsavoury. She enjoys many different friends during the course of her childhood. It takes some time for her to learn the value of commitment. This depends, of course, on other aspects of her birth chart. In rare cases this combination of the planets Venus and Uranus can indicate a child who has a very unusual hobby or pastime that replaces her need for playmates.

Pluto is Square Venus

Jane Doe forms strong emotional connections with friends and family. She is more likely to single out one friend or family member, rather than relate to many. This starts when Jane Doe is a baby and she forms a close attachment to her mother or a mother figure. Jane Doe demands this woman's full attention, refusing to share her mother with siblings or anyone else. On the one hand this can be a positive trait. Jane Doe is able to fully depend on a caring adult and therefore develop good self-esteem in the knowledge that she is deeply loved. She is able to deeply love in return.

A passionate child, Jane Doe throws herself wholeheartedly into her own life and relationships. Loved ones respond, aiding her development through the different stages of childhood. On the other hand Jane Doe's intensity can cause some problems. Jane Doe may closely guard her relationship with her mother. Siblings may be jealous. Mother may inadvertently break the bond with little Jane Doe thus sparking feelings of abandonment and rejection. Ill feeling and a lack of self-confidence then mar normal childhood development. Jane Doe resorts to manipulative means to try to maintain her dependence on her mother. Parents can best help Jane Doe by teaching her to understand and express her feelings in appropriate ways. With strong parental support Jane Doe becomes self-confident, able to form and maintain close ties with friends and family members. Commitment to associations and projects then becomes a major strength in young Jane Doe's life.

Saturn is Trine Mars

Young Jane Doe knows how to work and achieve. She has a serious side to her nature that is obvious from a young age. This is because safety and peace of mind play an important role in Jane Doe's childhood development. She needs to feel secure and is likely to play her part in achieving a sense of accomplishment and security. While other children are out playing Jane Doe is often at work. She is organised, hard working and honest with an ability to work methodically towards her goals. This is quite unusual in a young child. It is important for parents to ensure that Jane Doe is working to achieve her own desires rather than taking responsibility for others in the family. There is a temptation for less responsible members of the family to rely on young Jane Doe. Parents, in particular her father, need to encourage Jane Doe to have fun. Jane Doe is a practical child and may find it difficult to be frivolous and playful.

It is important that young Jane Doe is able to enjoy the carefree side of childhood. The more support

that she receives from her father, or an important father figure, the easier Jane Doe finds to adjust to the different stages of childhood development. She may achieve a prominent position in her career later in life or prove adept in running her own business later in life.

Uranus is Sextile Mars

What a little live wire! Jane Doe is a restless baby, quite a handful for her parents. She is eager to crawl and walk and takes off as soon as she can. Jane Doe revolts against any constraints, wriggling, kicking and possibly even biting. Parents need to give this independent child plenty of freedom while also teaching her appropriate behaviour. Jane Doe also needs to be taught about safety. She is impulsive and fearless, rarely thinking before she acts. On the positive side Jane Doe is quick to adapt to new circumstances. She does not fret, like some children, if unexpected events crop up or family life takes a sudden turnaround. If anything Jane Doe enjoys the excitement of change. Jane Doe also has plenty of initiative and enjoys challenges. On the other hand left to her devices Jane Doe quickly becomes bored and looks for thrills.

Without proper supervision Jane Doe can get into all sorts of strife. She is accident-prone. Parents need to ensure that Jane Doe's stamina is directed into safe and positive activities. This could include an unusual and demanding sport. Young Jane Doe responds well to spending time in active, or unusual, pursuits with her father. However, she does not like an authoritarian approach and is likely to rebel against strict rules and regulations.
